Overview

Seminar Description

Using Spreadsheet Programs in Real Estate Appraisals – The Basics was developed for both residential and non-residential real estate appraisers. Real estate brokers, review appraisers, and underwriters may also find the class useful.

The technological advances of the last 10 years have brought about significant changes in the real estate appraisal profession. For example, nearly all databases are computerized today, and it is imperative for appraisers to be able to retrieve, list, and analyze large quantities of data. Additionally, residential appraisers are searching for diversified client bases. This seminar introduces skills used for diverse services such as reporting statistical analysis and using graphs to make information clear. Participants will be introduced to common application in spreadsheet programs that apply to real estate appraisal and can be used in the sales comparison approach and a cost approach summary.

The seminar consists of five parts, which are divided into two sections. Parts 1 and 2 make up Section 1. Part 1 covers the basic advantages and uses of spreadsheets, and Part 2 demonstrates the use of common tools with a focus on the needs of appraisers. Part 3, which is the first part in Section 2, focuses on designing a spreadsheet for the three approaches to value. This is followed by Part 4, which is more advanced and covers statistical analysis. The final part, Part 5, consists of problems. Most classes will not complete all the material in Part 5. These problems were added for reference and study at home.

Class participation is strongly encouraged, since much can be learned from the collective experiences of the participants.

Learning Enhancements

The seminar has been designed with a variety of elements to enhance your learning experience.

- **Preview.** To give you a taste of what is to come, a Preview page begins each part and identifies learning objectives to consider as you move through the content.
- Learning Objectives. Each learning objective covers essential information you need to know to fully understand the concepts in the seminar. Look them over before each part begins so that you have a frame of reference as you move through the material. At the end of each part, reread the objectives. Are you able to perform what is stated? If not, this is the time to ask your instructor for help. Or, review the concepts that you do not understand.
- **In-Class Exercises and Problems.** Exercises and problems provide you with additional hands-on practice as you absorb what you are learning.

- **Examples.** A number of examples are scattered throughout the handbook to provide everyday illustrations of what you are learning.
- **Solutions**. Solutions to all problems and exercises appear behind the solutions tab at the back of your handbook.
